

I paint portraits, landscapes, and figures in a loose and juicy "remodern" (as opposed to post-modern) way. I have painted many bridges in my hometown of Washington, D.C., which is where I began my career as a professional painter. When I moved to the Hudson Valley in 2014, I started painting the Newburgh-Beacon, Tappan-Zee, and Cuomo bridges. I'm drawn to the soaring, monumental, take-your-breath-away quality of bridges. Their engineering and manpower are so mysterious and awesome that they are basically deities to me: man-made river-god-temples with wings spanning two shores, constantly bathed in the changing elements and the ceaseless sound and smell of lapping tides. Born and raised in Washington, D.C. with roots in the Adirondack mountains and Louisiana, I went to Reed College and was a social studies teacher for twelve years, including five years in Quito, Ecuador. I earned my MFA from SUNY New Paltz and live in Tarrytown with my wife, dog, and daughters.


